Please keep your pets and pet food indoors at night, and keep your garbage lids and pet doors secured. **SALMON RUNS:** Beaux Arts is a member of a group of governmental agencies working on preserving and enhancing salmon runs in the Cedar River watershed. We were recently advised of a fun opportunity to observe salmon runs in our neighborhood: Bellevue-You can often see salmon returning to *Kelsey Creek in October* at the Mercer Slough fish ladder south of SE 8<sup>th</sup> in Bellevue. Park in lots just before and after the site, look for the creek sign, walk down the path and look for the interpretive signs.

**VOLUNTEER BOARD POSITION AVAILABLE FOR A Regional Coalition for Housing (ARCH):**  
Make your voice heard on affordable housing funding and programs by joining the ARCH Citizen Advisory Board (CAB). The CAB consists of twelve to fifteen community residents and housing professionals that work with ARCH staff to evaluate local housing funding proposals and increase awareness of housing issues on the Eastside. Board members contribute their understanding of housing and community issues, as well as certain specialized perspectives including real estate, housing development, planning, finance, assisting persons with low income or special needs, faith community, racial diversity, architecture and residents of affordable housing. The CAB also strives to be representative of the Eastside communities that make up ARCH. The CAB typically meets one Wednesday evening per month for two hours. **NEXT WABA MEETING:** The next regular meeting of the WABA Board of Trustees will be held at 7:00pm on Thursday, September 4, 2008 at Joann Bromberg's house.

**WABA FALL WORK PARTY:** The planting plans for the late October WABA work party at the Beach were reviewed at the August WABA Board meeting. After listening to inputs from interested meeting participants, the Trustees agreed that the deadline for written petitions requesting change to the proposed planting plan would be September 19, 2008. It was further

agreed that the Trustees would review the petitions at the October 2, 2008 Board meeting. The meeting participants were reminded that they have to follow the following process for their petition to be considered by the Board:

1. Petitioner must have met in person with the Woodlands Manager (Sheila Justus) in an attempt to address concerns about specific plantings prior to submitting their petition to the Board.
2. Petitions must be in writing and must be submitted to the WABA mailbox by September 19, 2008.
3. Any petition to change the location of proposed plantings, or eliminate plantings from the current plan must be in keeping with the Woodlands Vision and Guidelines. Petitioner must state how the current proposed location of plantings is out of agreement with the Woodlands Vision and Guidelines, stating specific language from this document.

ATTENTION DOG OWNERS! Dogs are strictly forbidden in the swim area at the south beach until Labor Day (WABA Rule 11.A.9). Please respect other members and the time it took to create the dog rule by walking your dog through the South parking lot. Mutts mitts are provided for your convenience in two locations at the north and mid beach areas. Residents are reminded the lifeguard will tie up dogs on the loose in the swim area until their shift ends. Continued violators will be encouraged to attend a WABA meeting.
