

- Water Supervisor Durr also recommended that the Council adopt a water-conservation goal of 240 gal/day per household, which is the national average for water use. He added that the Water Department will continue its work to reduce system leakage.
- Councilmember Stowe reported that the 108th Committee continues looking at ways to fund improvements to this ROW, prioritizing the various elements of the vision, and developing a more detailed plan for the improvements. Councilmember Sharp will add the cost of maintaining the Town's portion of 108th Ave SE to the Transportation Improvement Plan that he is developing for 2011-2016. This plan will be presented to the Council during a public hearing at the July 13th Council meeting.
- The Council adopted Resolution No. 261 authorizing the mayor to execute an Interlocal Agreement with King County for the temporary continuation of Animal Control Services. The contract is for 2-1/2 years, and all of the other Eastside cities are signing it as well. During the term of the contract, Bellevue, Redmond, and Mercer Island are looking at other options for providing animal-control services to their cities. Beaux Arts will seek to participate in whatever plan gives us the best service at the lowest price.

NEXT COUNCIL MEETING: The next meeting of the Town Council will be held at **7:00pm on Tuesday, July 13, 2010** at Steve Eulau's house.

CYCLING EVENT: On Sunday August 15th, the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation will sponsor a cycling event that will pass through the Village along the 104th-105th arterial. Approximately 75 cyclists will leave the Columbia Winery in Woodinville at 8am. Whether all 75 will pass through the Village remains to be seen, but event promoters expect the cyclists to be spread out well before they arrive in Beaux Arts, so the impact on Villagers should be minimal. CITY OF BELLEVUE TO ASSESS SEWER LAKE LINE: With 13 miles of aging sewer pipes in and along Lake Washington, the City of Bellevue will begin assessing the condition of the entire sewer lake line this summer. Over the next couple of years, Bellevue Utilities employees and consultants will assess the 8- and 10-inch pipes buried in the lake bed and take samples of the pipes as well as run cameras through the pipes to view them from the inside.

The lake line serves lakefront and upland properties in Bellevue, Yarrow Point, Hunts Point, Medina, and Beaux Arts, plus a small portion of unincorporated King County near Renton. Much of the line, built in the 1950s and 1960s, may be nearing the end of its useful life. If aging lake line pipes break, residents can lose service, and raw sewage can flow into the lake, possibly damaging shoreline habitat and closing beaches. Assessment of the lake line will help Utilities produce a "road map" to determine areas of pipe that need rehabilitation or replacement or that have more years of use.

One challenge of the project is that development along the lake has made access to and maintenance of a number of pipes difficult. Utilities will need permission from residents to access private property and dig up the ground in various places to get pipe samples. In many locations, crews will also need to access cleanouts and manholes to videotape the pipe.

The completed study will help guide scheduled maintenance, in addition to being part of a larger Capital Improvement Program (CIP) to design, permit and construct replacements or rehabilitations. Utilities will contact local property owners to give them more details about the project, and have already contacted our Town Clerk; see Sue Ann Spens for more details.

NEXT WABA BOARD MEETING: The next regular meeting of the Western Academy of Beaux Arts Board of Trustees will be held at **7:00pm on Thursday, July 1, 2010** at the Burlingame's house. At this meeting the Trustees will be voting on the following policy change which has been discussed for several months, on guest memberships for co-residents.

Proposal: Add 3.5.1 to the Bylaws

3.5.1 Guest Membership for a Co-resident. A co-resident is defined as a person who is paying or providing services in kind to reside with a member on their lot. A co-resident does not have the right to independent use of the Beach and other facilities of the Corporation unless they are approved for guest membership by the Board of Trustees. A guest membership for a co-resident will be assessed at the same rate as a membership in WABA, but shall not be entitled to vote or serve on the Board of Trustees. This obligation will continue annually so long as the co-resident resides with the member. The WABA assessment for the co-resident will be prorated for any partial year that the co-resident resides with the member. Guest membership requests for a co-resident must be accompanied by a payment for the current year, prorated as necessary. The member shall be responsible for the guest member assessment.

WABA SHORELINE-BEACH PLANNING COMMITTEE:

The WABA Shoreline Project has completed three public meetings for Villagers' input. John Barker's team will prepare the preferred alternative design for permit drawings for the targeted areas of enhancement, and permit applications. A grant proposal for KCD to fund permitting costs is under review. Please contact Joann Bromberg if you have questions. BEACH CURFEW: Reminder to all WABA members: For many years, WABA has experienced use of the beach by non-residents, particularly teenager parties resulting in fires, trash and property damage. In an effort to protect this asset, many years ago WABA passed rules to prevent these disturbances. Per the Green Book, the rule is that **the Beach is closed after 10:30 pm except to WABA MEMBERS.** Children, even older teenagers, are not WABA members and may not be at the beach unless accompanied by a MEMBER, e.g., their parent.

King County Sheriff patrols will close the beach at 10:30 pm each evening to all people except WABA MEMBERS, e.g., adults, or children/teenagers, DIRECTLY accompanied by their parents. Please show the Deputies your courtesy as they are only doing their job. If WABA members have issue with the current rules; they may contact the WABA Board.
