

writing workshops, finding the information needed to apply for grant funding, and assisting the Council in completing the daunting task or applying for this funding.

- As part of the Shoreline Management Plan update project, the Council reviewed the proposed Draft Shoreline Analysis report, which is due for submittal to the state around the end of July, and decided that they needed input from Beaux Arts residents about the content of the report and some additional time to amend the report to ensure that the Town doesn't inadvertently restrict the practical future use of WABA's property. NEXT COUNCIL MEETING: The next meeting of the Town Council will be held at 7:00pm on Tuesday, September 14, 2010 at Mike Hillberg's house. There is no regular meeting scheduled in August.

CYCLING EVENT REMINDER: On Sunday August 15th, the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation will sponsor a cycling event that will pass through the Village along the 104th-105th arterial. Approximately 75 cyclists will leave the Columbia Winery in Woodinville at 8am. Whether all 75 will pass through the Village remains to be seen, but event promoters expect the cyclists to be spread out well before they arrive in Beaux Arts, so the impact on Villagers should be minimal. PHONE-BOOK DELIVERY OPTIONS: Don't like the sight of phone books jumbled under our mail stands where they sit for months? The Council has heard your concerns and is contacting Qwest asking them to deliver phone books directly to individual homes or cease deliver. In addition, there are several actions you can take directly:

1. Visit <http://www.catalogchoice.org/> to opt out of print-directory deliveries. You will need to remember that the company names you'll need are "Dex" and "Yellow Book".
2. You may also wish to visit <http://YellowPagesoptout.com>, a site created by the phone-book industry to reduce or eliminate the deliveries of print directories.

WHICH MAILBOX IS WHICH? There continues to be a lot of confusion about which box to use for various payments, correspondence, and outgoing mail. Here is a brief reminder about which box to use:

- **WATER PAYMENTS:** All payments for water bills may be placed in the locked box on the mail stand nearest the water tower. This box is identified as "TOWN OF BEAUX ARTS VILLAGE / BEAUX ARTS WATER DEPARTMENT". Of course, you may continue mailing your payments to BAWD, 10530 SE 27th Street, Beaux Arts, WA 98004.
- **TOWN CORRESPONDENCE:** Correspondence intended for the Town Council, staff, and other boards and commissions may be placed in the locked box on the mail stand nearest the water tower. This is the same box as for WATER PAYMENTS and is identified as "TOWN OF BEAUX ARTS VILLAGE / BEAUX ARTS WATER DEPARTMENT". You may also mail correspondence to Town of Beaux Arts Village, 10550 SE 27th Street, Beaux Arts, WA 98004.
- **WABA PAYMENTS AND CORRESPONDENCE:** All correspondence and payments to the Western Academy of Beaux Arts (WABA) may be placed in the locked box on the mail stand on SE 28th Street just west of 104th Avenue SE. This box is identified as "WABA".

You may also mail payments and correspondence to WABA, 10010 SE 28th Pl, Beaux Arts, WA 98004.

- **OUTGOING MAIL:** All outgoing mail, i.e. stamped mail you want the postal carrier to take back to the Post Office for delivery to another address should be placed in the green mailbox just west of the mail stand on SE 28th Street just west of 104th Ave SE. This mailbox is identified as "OUTGOING MAIL" and "U.S. MAIL".

Please remember that the Town of Beaux Arts Village and the Western Academy of Beaux Arts are two completely separate entities. Each employs its own clerks to conduct business in their own spaces. If you place mail for one entity in the box of another, the clerks will do their best to forward your mail in the correct box in a timely manner. But delays are inevitable, so please use the correct box to avoid possible late charges and/or lost mail.

If you wish to contact your neighbors for any other purpose, please get their verbal approval first, and keep their email address in the "bcc" column. If you prefer "snail mail", or if you wish your email address to not be published in the green book, but for the clerks to keep private for our business use only, please advise Andrea Sharp. Also remember if you ever receive an email from anyone you don't want, you can ask to be removed from their list, mark as "spam", "unsubscribe", or say "no thank you" just as you would for any unwanted phone call, mail, or solicitor at your door.
