**COUNCIL BUSINESS:** There was no Council meeting in August.

**NEXT COUNCIL MEETING:** The next regular meeting of the Town Council will be held at 7:00pm on **Tuesday September 8, 2015** at Cynthia Hudson's house.

**KING COUNTY ASSESSOR:** The latest assessor's report is available; see the attachment with details.

**MARSHAL REPORT:** Villagers will note that, until recently, Beaux Arts went almost a year without crime incidents. This is due to a combination of the following three factors: LUCK and:

- Criminals are aware of being noticed or (especially) followed. Villagers have become more cognizant of the indications of impending burglaries (recognizing the teams who pose as door-to-door salespeople). BAV residents are doing a better job of "looking out for each other" and on two occasions have foiled burglaries in the Enatai/ BAV area over the past year by taking action and calling 911 when viewing suspicious activity.
- In the past, almost all car prowls and home burglaries involved entry through unlocked entry points. BAV residents are now locking their homes, using alarms and locking their cars inside their garages. As a result, the thieves and burglars that were hitting the soft targets (easy as in open screened windows or unlocked doors), are now becoming more aggressive, by necessity, by breaking windows to force entry.

In the last 45 days, on SE 29<sup>th</sup> in the upper Village, windows were smashed in a daytime home burglary (almost all of these occur during the weekday business hours) and a night car break-in. Three reminders:

- Re: Car Prowls - If you must leave your car on the street, do not leave anything that looks like it could contain valuables (like a bag with contents not visible); the cost and hassle of repairing your car will almost always exceed the value of the stolen items.
- If a stranger approaches your house and you do not wish to open your door, then that is your right. But in all cases, you should try to show them that someone is at home by flicking on/ off lights, moving curtains to look outside and so on. The biggest risk we face is danger to individuals who inadvertently confront burglars in their house. Remember, these thieves are driven by the theft of valuable items that are easy to pawn or sell; they're not interested in hurting homeowners. However, startled thieves could act unpredictably- especially if they feel cornered or trapped in your home.

- 70-90% of burglaries occur by professional criminals. If they are caught, many crimes are prevented. August activity in the Beaux Arts / Enatai area includes the following:

**PRESCRIPTION DRUG TAKE-BACK:** The 10th National Prescription Drug Take-Back will take place September 26th from 10 am-2 pm local time. As with the previous nine Take-Back events, sites will be set up throughout communities nationwide so local residents can return their unwanted, unneeded, or expired prescription drugs for safe disposal. Visit [www.dea.gov](http://www.dea.gov) for collection sites listed after September 1st. Many Americans do not know how to properly dispose of their unused medicine, often flushing them down the toilet or throwing them away – both potential safety and health hazards. "Prescription drug abuse is a huge problem and this is a great opportunity for folks around the country to help reduce the threat," Rosenberg said. "Please clean out your medicine cabinet and make your home safe from drug theft and abuse." In the previous nine Take-Back events nationwide from 2010-2014: 4,823,251 pounds or 2,411 tons of drugs were collected.

Be sure to check the WABA Calendar on the website ([www.waba1908.com](http://www.waba1908.com)) to see what's available, please be aware that reservations are not allowed on Sundays or Holidays, and that reservation times cannot overlap. When you host a gathering, you are responsible for removing your trash and disposing of it in your containers at home. **COMMONS MASTER PLAN:** The meeting on August 22<sup>nd</sup> to review the draft of the WABA Commons Master Plan was well attended by members; thank you to everyone who was able to come! **DOG RULES:** Continuing through Labor Day, the WABA Summer Dog Rules are in effect:

- Dogs are never allowed at the swim beach or dock during the summer.
- Dogs are allowed on the north end of the beach and lawn extending from the northern boundary of the Town of Beaux Arts to the opening in the break wall to the southwest corner of the tennis court.
- Dogs may be walked from the northern part of the beach at the eastern edge of the lawn to the southern access road up behind the center BBQ.
- The summer dog swimming area is located at the opening in the break wall at the beach's north end. Please be respectful of others and do not allow your dog to disrupt members using the picnic tables, and always clean up after your dog! There are pet waste bag dispensers located at the center beach and at the north end. A complete list of the rules is in Section 11 of your Greenbook.

**HISTORY CORNER:** The Seattle Post described a local Seattle architect's trademarks earlier this year to include: "*Broad windows, hovering protective rooflines, exposed framing and an emphasis on verticality became his signature. Many designs feature a formal T-shape plan, and take in dramatic views of the water or mountains and today epitomize what has become known as the Northwest Regional Style.*" Oh, don't forget the use of natural materials, especially cedar, inside and out! Who are they talking about? Architect Ralph D. Anderson, of course! Lost a half-decade ago, this iconic architectural legend left his mark on modernism and preservationism. Ralph Anderson began his career working with the legendary Paul Kirk, and is best known today for his own work in Pioneer Square and what we know as *Northwest Contemporary* architecture today. What does that have to do with Beaux Arts Village? Beaux Arts boasts a variety of architectural styles spanning over a century, involving the works of a few well-known architects, including at least a couple of original Ralph Anderson designs....can you name them?
